Downtown Overview

Menomonee Falls Downtown is a vibrant destination “Where Main & Appleton Meet.” We call this the “heart” of our Downtown. Led by our jewel - Village Park, the area is a walker’s delight with the natural beauty of the Menomonee River waterfall, Lepper Dam, the Riverwalk, Mill Pond and Lime Kiln Park ... all within a several block area in the heart of Downtown.

Menomonee Falls Downtown District offers a diverse range of dining and shopping experiences for locals and tourists alike. The area is home to several locally owned restaurants, cafes, and bars that offer unique and flavorful cuisine, from classic American fare to international dishes. 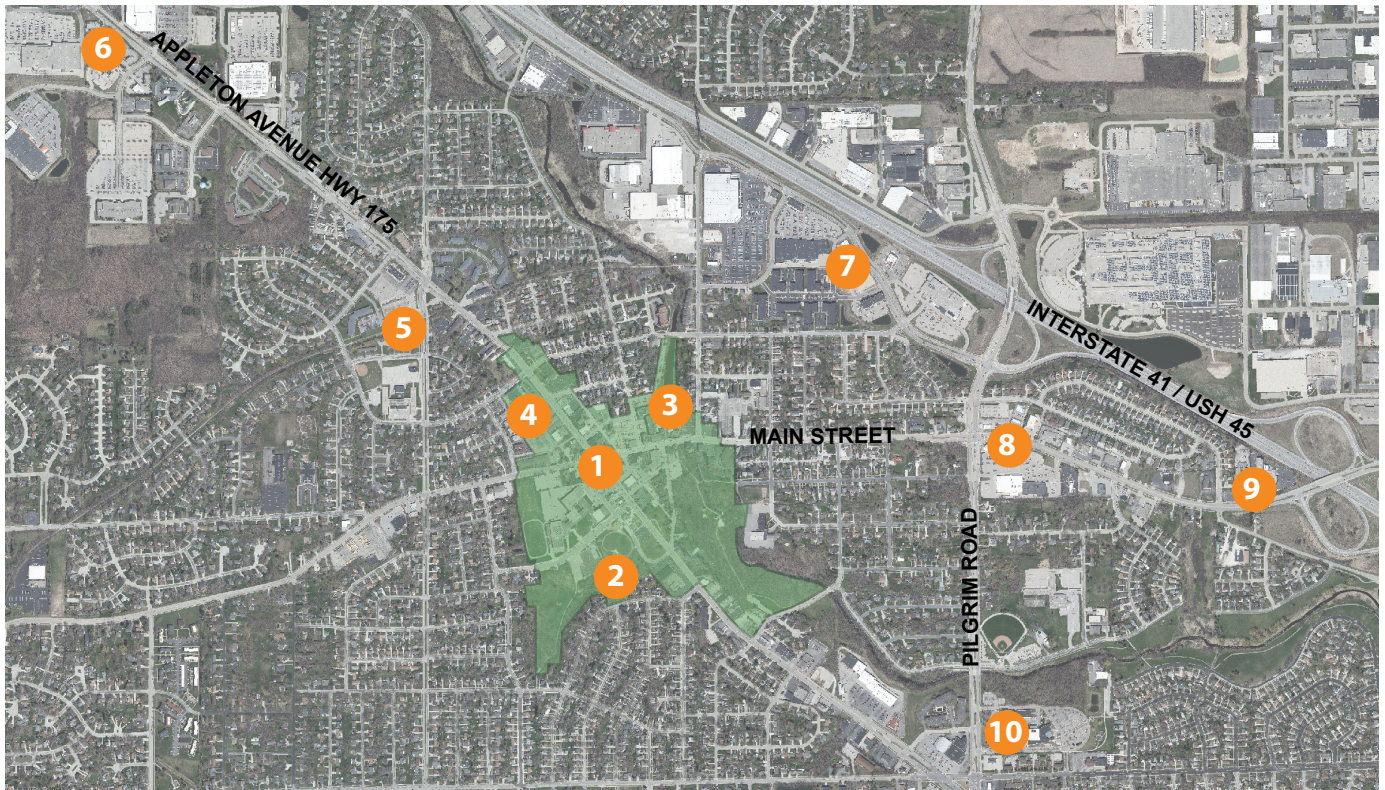
Demographics

Downtown and surrounding neighborhoods are a key part of the growing Menomonee Falls community providing an environment where businesses and residents are located in a walkable setting. Within a five mile radius (an approximately 10 minute drive) there are more than 80,000 residents and more than 32,500 households. Over 40 percent of households earn at least \$100,000 annually and over 53 percent of adults have earned a college degree. The 94.5 percent housing occupancy rate reflects the strong demand for real estate in the area, and the relative balance across age cohorts indicates that Menomonee Falls attracts residents of all ages.

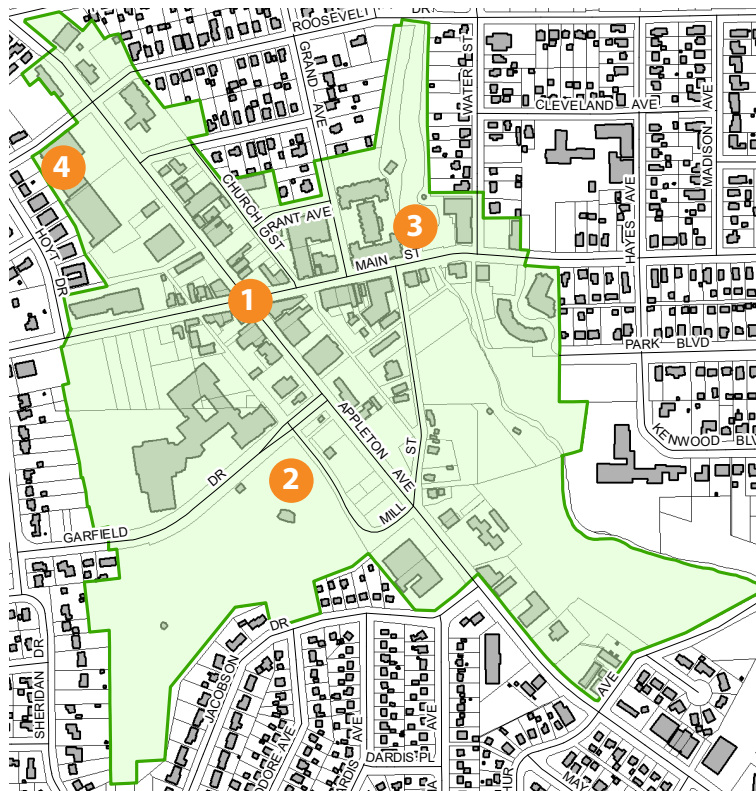

Economic Development Tools

There are several programs available to help facilitate redevelopment and business growth in downtown Menomonee Falls. These tools combined with attractive sites, public amenities, and market capacity make downtown an ideal investment environment.

Tax Increment Financing

The Village established Tax Increment District No. 9 (TID No. 9) as a mixed-use district to promote the revitalization of downtown and the surrounding neighborhood. The project plan identifies key parcels for private sector redevelopment and outlines a number of public improvements designed to make downtown an attractive location.

Economic Development Master Fund Grant Program

The Village of Menomonee Falls allocated funds for the Economic Development Master Fund (EDMF) grant program with the intent to improve properties and enhance the tax base within the downtown. All businesses and property owners in TID No. 9 are eligible to apply for an EDMF matching grant (up to \$20,000) to assist with qualified exterior building improvements. Through 2022, dozens of matching facade grants have been approved, providing over \$560,000 in grant funds which have aided the private sector in transforming the aesthetics of downtown.

Business Development Loan Pool

The Business Development Loan Pool (BDLP) program was created in partnership with Bank Five Nine to provide low interest loans to downtown businesses and property owners for qualified projects. Multiple businesses have utilized the BDLP to finance start up costs and expansions, with over \$480,000 approved in downtown since 2015.



Frequently Asked Questions

Do I need an Occupancy Permit before opening my business?

Yes, but before opening a new business in downtown Menomonee Falls, it is recommended you contact the Engineering and Development Department at the Village of Menomonee Falls to ensure the proposed use complies with the Municipal Code before applying for your Occupancy Permit. An email to cd@menomonee-falls.org is always a great first step.

Do I need a Sign Permit to install a new sign?

A Sign Permit is required when updating existing or installing new exterior signs. It is always recommended to contact the Zoning Department at Village Hall before installing any new signs.

Can I have outdoor seating on the sidewalk in front of my business?

The Village does allow outdoor dining on public sidewalks within the downtown under the issuance of an Outdoor Café Permit. Contact the Engineering and Development Department at cd@menomonee-falls.org for additional information and to obtain the application for an Outdoor Café Permit.

Are there grant or loan programs offered by the Village for new or existing businesses?

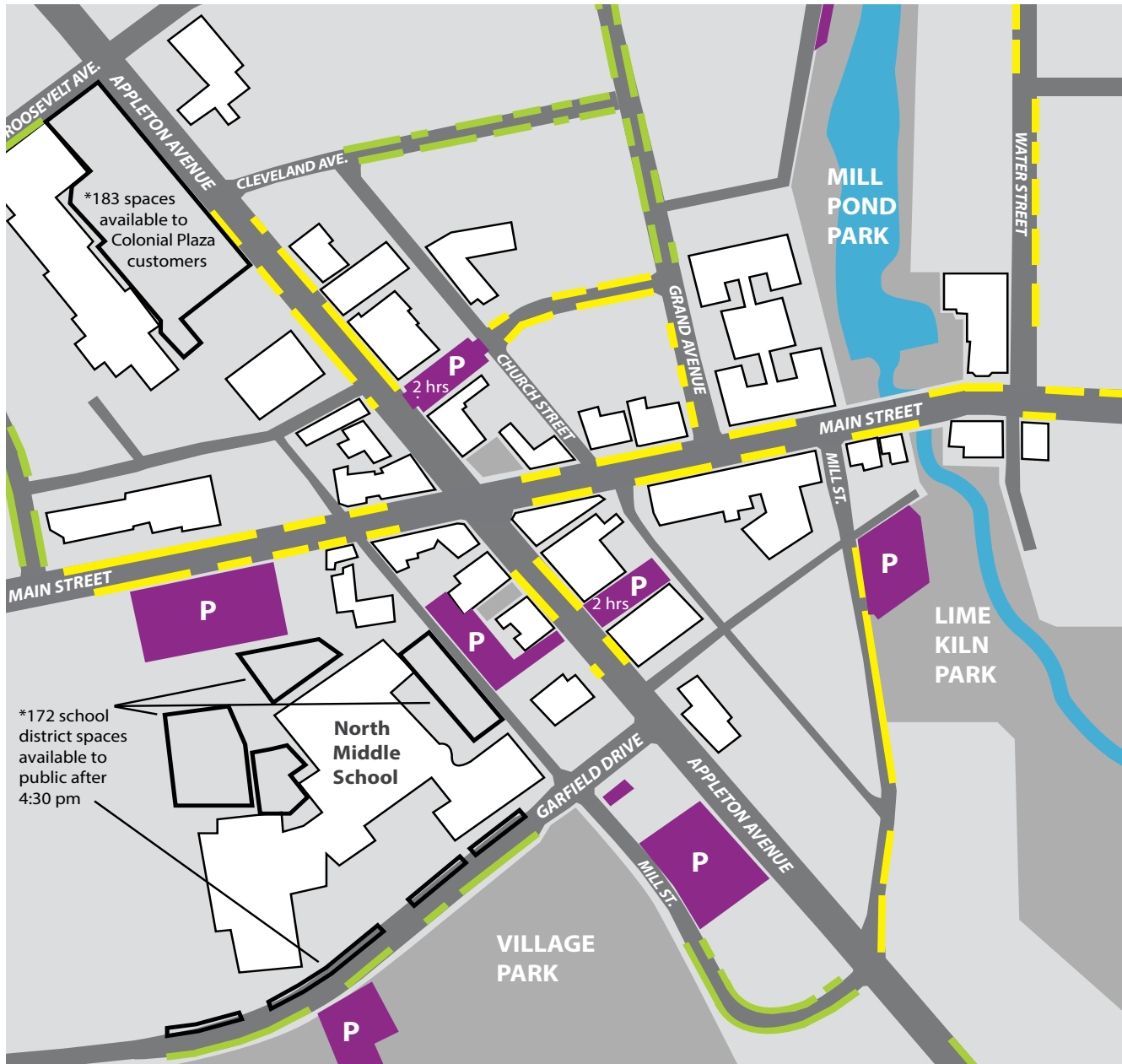
The Village offers a matching grant for exterior improvements to buildings located within Tax Incremental District No. 9. There is also a low interest rate loan program for projects ranging from start-up costs to building remodels. Is my building in a Business Improvement District and how can I get involved?



If you are located downtown, it is very likely that your business is located within the boundaries of the Menomonee Falls downtown Business Improvement District. Snow Emergencies

No vehicle may be parked on any street, alley or highway when the Village declares a snow emergency (except for loading & unloading).

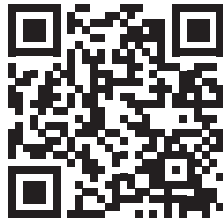
